



White storks spend every winter in Africa before flying back to Europe in the spring to build nests, lay eggs and raise their young. Research suggests that the population of white storks in Europe may be significantly affected by farming practices.

Scientists in Lithuania, an eastern European nation, found that over a 16-year period, the number of white stork nests in that country doubled. The scientists believe that changes in farming practices may have been the primary reason.

In the early 1990s, land reform took place in Lithuania. Large, managed farms were broken up. Most of the land was sold to private buyers. A significant amount of land was simply abandoned. Over time, this abandoned farm land changed completely. Where there had been crops, meadows and wet land appeared. These grassy areas provided excellent nesting and feeding sites for white storks. Meanwhile, farmers began to use fewer chemicals on their fields. This also improved the environment for white storks.

As a consequence of these changes, the number of white stork nests in Lithuania doubled between 1994 and 2010. At the end of the study period, the scientists found that the number of baby storks in the nests also had increased. One out of fifty nests had at least five chicks, about one of six nests had four chicks, more than four out of ten nests had 3 chicks. and one out of three nests had 2 chicks. Fewer than one out of ten nests had only 1 chick.


The scientists also observed that white storks found new sites for their nests. Many of them built their nests high above the ground on the top of electricity line poles. Nests built on electricity line poles were less stable, and the electricity in the lines could pose a threat to the young. On the other hand, by building their nests in these high locations, the storks kept their young safe from hungry animals down on the ground. In the end, these new sites

proved successful. Such locations are still used by white storks today. (7/15, 16)

In recent years, the most widely watched streaming services have been Hulu, Prime Video, Disney+ and Netflix. Competition between them has







Wars between countries claim vast numbers of lives. After the fighting stops, weapons left over from the wars continue to injure and kill people. The third stage is a time of deep sleep. Our muscles relax further, we breathe more slowly, and our blood pressure decreases. During this period, we are less aware of noises or activity in our environment. In the fourth stage, our brains become much more active. We also experience rapid eye movement (REM). Meanwhile, our bodies remain relaxed and still. It is mainly during this period that we dream. Scientists believe that we also use this time to process and store our emotional memories.

Scientists believe that the brainstem causes us to go into REM sleep. However, our dreams emerge not from the brainstem but from the middle part of our brains. Scientists discovered this by observing people with injuries to these parts of the brain. During REM sleep, several neurotransmitters become more or less prominent. This may be the reason why dreams seem so much stranger than waking life.


